UNIVERSITY CENTRE SOMERSET HIGHER EDUCATION FEES POLICY 26-27

As submitted to the Office for Students in line with the approved Access & Participation Plan and/or appropriate OFS Annual Fees Summary.

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1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1. This policy confirms the decision made by the Senior Management Team (SMT) in October 2025 in relation to Higher Education (HE) Fees for 2026-27.
- 1.2. The relevant fees set out in this policy are provided to the Office for Students (OfS) as required, by their annual deadline.
- 1.3. The OfS will monitor to ensure that UCS does not charge more than the fees that it is approved for, in line with our annual fee return.

2. SCOPE

- 2.1. These fees specifically relate to Single Registerable Modules, Professional Certificate, Foundation Degrees, three-year Degrees, Level 6 Top Up Degrees, HNCs, HNDs, Cert Ed and PGCE.
- 2.2. These fees will start from September 2026 and will apply to new students starting at that point, **NOT** existing students.
- 2.3. These fees do **NOT** relate to professional courses or Degree Apprenticeships at level 4 or above or other situations where prices are negotiated directly with employers which are approved by SMT on an individual basis.
- 2.4. This policy does not affect the prices already negotiated with employers for which contracts have been agreed and the price already set for the length of the contract.

3. TUITION FEES

- 3.1. The majority of HE fees for 2026-27 will remain the same as those last academic year (2025-26) at £8950pa for a full-time degree course, pro rata for part-time and pro-rata for individual modules/units. The pro-rata element is based on the number of credits studied in the academic year, with 120 credits being full time. The **exceptions** are:
 - Full time BSc (Hons) Nursing direct entry route which will be £9250pa in line with delivery across the sector for nursing degrees nationally.
 - Student Nurse Associate direct entry route will also be £9250pa.
 - Assistant Practitioner (Occupational Therapy) direct entry will also be £9250.

3.2. Full-time courses:

3.3. Part-time courses:

*Please note that the Access & Participation Plan approved by the OfS allows for student fees to be reviewed and for these to increase annually in line with the Retail Price Index (RPI-X) once students are on programme. **The fees stated above are therefore the fee for new entrants into year one of their course in 2026-27** and may increase (only in line with the Retail Price Index) in subsequent years on the course if approved by SMT.

In relation to any other subsequent increases, **students will remain on the same rate on which they started their programme and new fees approved by SMT will only relate to new starters not existing students** in line with usual practice at UCS

3.4. Sub contractual Provision

3.5. Employer-funded groups of students ie for HNC/D

If an employer wishes to send a group of students on an HE course, the relevant College Principal or Dean of UCS will oversee the fees that are negotiated as appropriate from the starting point of £7800 per annum, (pro-rata for part time). It is up to that Senior Manager to decide what constitutes a 'group' of students and therefore their willingness to negotiate reduced rates, bearing in mind other considerations relevant to the individual situation, signed off by the College Principal. In such instances, the Group Finance Director and Group Director Funding & Operations will need to be informed of any variations of course fees being charged so that this information is centrally captured on Pro.

3.6. International Fees

Fees for international students will remain at £3000 above the standard fee. This means a usual full-time fee of £8950 + £3000 = £11,950pa. Part time students would be a pro-rata fee over the years of their course.

However, we are not currently issuing CAS for international student visa sponsorship.

3.7. Fees for module / stage retakes

If a student is required to retake a module or year of study, they will be charged the tuition fees proportional for the credits being retaken in relation to the full tuition fee cost.

e.g. If 1 year of study is 120 credits = £9,250 and a student is required to retake 60 credits before progressing to the next academic year, which is a half of the full year's credits, this will equate to a half of the year's fees = £4,625.

If a student is able to progress onto the next academic year and trail a retake module they will be charged the cost of the module on top of the full year's tuition fee for that programme.

e.g. If 120 credits = £9,250 and a student is trailing 20 credits, which is a sixth of the full year's credits, this will equate to a sixth of the year's fees (i.e. £1,541.66) being added to the full tuition fee for the next stage. For example: £9,250 + £1,541.66 =£10,791.66.

It is the student's responsibility to check and ensure their eligibility for student finance funding should they access this through Student Finance England, to ensure timely payment of tuition fees in line with the UCS HE Terms and Conditions.

All debts must be cleared prior to the completion of the academic year in which the retake or trailed modules are completed in to avoid being held up at Award Board.

4. PROCEDURE

- 4.1. The Dean of UCS provides SMT with a proposal for the fees for the next academic year. This is timed to fit with the OfS deadline for the Annual Fee Information (AFI) Return.
- 4.2. Once approval has been given by SMT, the Dean of UCS produces this fees policy for the year in question which is submitted to the Policy Review Group for approval and is also made available to Senate who are the highest academic authority for HE at UCS
- 4.3. The Dean of UCS completes the Annual Fee Information Return with the support of the MIS Technical Manager if required and uploads it to the OfS portal by the deadline stated, where required.
- 4.4. The Annual Fee Information Return is only concerned with HE provision for which UCS holds responsibility for reporting on the ILR/HESES return. It does *not* include franchised provision such as PGCE/Cert Ed which is franchised from the University of Plymouth. Those universities cover these programmes in their returns. Degree apprenticeships are also omitted from the return. Full guidance is available from the Office for Students.
- 4.5. The PGCE / Cert Ed are included in this fees policy even though they are not included in the return to OfS, because UCS set the fee that is charged to students on this University of Plymouth-validated course which therefore needs to be agreed by SMT. The fee cannot exceed the maximum fee set by the University of Plymouth in their return to the OfS.
- 4.6. The MIS Team use this fees policy to input the fees onto Pro Solution for each HE course, and this information then pulls through to the website.
- 4.7. The Marketing Team use this fees policy to add the fees to UCAS and the UCS website.

5. REVIEW OF POLICY

- 5.1. This policy will be reviewed annually in line with the Annual Fee Information Return to the Office for Students.
- 5.2. This policy will be made available to the Senate who oversee HE at UCS.
